Here are step by step directions on how to creatively make a shaker at home:


Step 1: Find an object that can be the outside of your shaker. This can be a tupperware, an emptied spice bottle, a recycled bottle with a cap, etc.

Step 2: Find some material to put inside that can be shaken around. This can be be dry rice or beans, tic tacs, small rocks, etc. Don't fill it too much. You need space to shake!
