In addition to three Summer Series concerts, three Piano and Friends concerts, and five Winter Chamber Music Festival events (plus our fabulous Festival Celebration), our 2022-23 season featured an unprecedented nine Evening Series concerts and six AFCM commissions, two of which were premiered at our 2023 Winter Chamber Music Festival. Five of the Evening Series concerts were holdovers from the pandemic, which is not quite done with us as we have squeezed in several other previously planned concerts and commissions into the current and two (!) following seasons.

We are proud that AFCM continues to bring such incredibly important musical art to Tucson. We offer the world's finest ensembles already or yet-to-be famous, playing time-honored classics alongside less-familiar works including new compositions with our name on them making their way into the contemporary repertoire, and outreach through master classes and rehearsals, Music in the Schools, and our Tucson Adult Chamber Players programs. All of this is made possible by your enthusiasm for chamber music and your generous support throughout each year.

EVENING SERIES

The Evening Series, AFCM's foundational and trademark series, continued its tradition of presenting live performances by the world's best artists. Some of the season's concerts were holdovers from pre-pandemic plans, such as Apollon Musagète with Garrick Ohlsson, the Juilliard String Quartet giving the long-awaited world premieres of two AFCM co-commissions of works by Jórg Widmann, and Hub New Music celebrating their tenth anniversary with an AFCM commission of a multi-media work by Angélica Negrón.

We had also co-commissioned Nokuthula Ngwenyama to join the esteemed Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson trio in presenting her new work. That concert became a touching tribute to the late Joseph Kalichstein, with Anna Polonsky joining Nokuthula and the remaining members of KLR.

Rounded out by AFCM favorite Takács Quartet, and with Tucson premieres by Cuarteto Casals and Dolce Suono Trio, our Evening Series presented an unprecedented nine concerts in all, with four AFCM commissions:

Apollon Musagète Quartet (with Garrick Ohlsson, piano)

Juilliard String Quartet (two evenings, including commissions of two works by Jörg Widmann)

Concert Honoring Joseph Kalichstein (including commission of a work by violist/composer Nokuthula Ngwenyama)

Hub New Music (including a commission of a work by Angélica Negrón) Cuarteto Casals

The Tucson Winter Chamber Music Festival celebrated its 29th year with brilliant musicians and exciting concerts. The Jupiter Quartet and Sitkovetsky Trio were joined by the wind quintet Windscape, and pianist David Fung for a week of performances that featured Steven Taylor's 2021 Chaconne/Labyrinth and a world premiere by Julia Adolphe. Other Festival events included Open Rehearsals, Master Classes, a lively Youth Concert, a Silent Auction, Pre-Concert Conversations, and the annual Festival Celebration...where patrons meet, mingle, and dine with all of the Festival artists after a concert in the hall.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS


In the 2022-2023 season, AFCM spent \$8500 on our Music in the Schools outreach program, which brings free concerts into local schools, with a special focus on Title 1 schools. After two seasons of recorded concerts, schools were thrilled to have live concerts again for their students. We sponsored concerts by the Southwest Strings Quintet and UA's Fred Fox School Wind Quintet and Graduate String Quartet in multiple schools, some for the first time:

TUCSON ADULT CHAMBER PLAYERS (TACP)

TACP engages members of the AFCM community and beyond who not only love to listen to chamber music, but to play it as well! Participants of the program are also eligible for \$12 student ticket prices to AFCM concerts. String, wind, or piano players of all levels, ages, and abilities are invited to join TACP. Pre-formed groups are welcome too. Participants have eight 90-minute coaching sessions with professional musicians. The season culminates with ensembles performing 8-10 minutes of music. The recital allows the participants a chance to show off what they've learned. Two TACP concerts took place in 2022–23: December 10, 2022 and May 21 2023, with 15 and 14 participants performing.


Current ticket sales cover only 35.3% of our annual expenses. We rely on the generosity of our patrons to support AFCM now and for future generations of lovers of chamber music.



FY 2023 OPERATING INCOME

TOTAL: \$386,095

Operating income and expenses exclude investment revenue and fund management fees. Fund management fees offset total investment revenue resulting in a net gain of \$4,297 in investment assets for the 2022-23 fiscal year.
